Welcome Alison McNulty - Director of Ann Street Gallery

In February, we were delighted to welcome Gallery Director **Alison McNulty** to the Safe Harbors team. Alison is an interdisciplinary artist, educator, and curator, and brings with her over 20 years' experience creating art and educational programming that highlight underrepresented perspectives and undervalued practices, create space for awareness and care of the non-human world, and ground conversations around art in physical practices, communities, and places.



Alison earned a BFA in sculpture from Washington University in St. Louis and completed her MFA at the University of Florida where she received the Alumni Fellowship. She has taught at Whitman College, University of Florida, Brooklyn College, Marist College, the French-American School of New York, and The College School of Webster Groves, MO. She is currently Part-Time Assistant Professor at Parsons School of Design and served on the College Art Association's Services to Artists professional committee.

Alison's practice as an artist explores the layered histories of ordinary reclaimed materials, precarity in sites and species, and the ecological entanglements of humans. Her work has been presented at museums, galleries, conferences, and unconventional spaces throughout the US and in Europe and Columbia. She was recently awarded an Arts Mid-Hudson Individual Artist Commission Grant, a Saltonstall Foundation Residency Fellowship, the 2022 Stone & DeGuire Contemporary Art Award, an Empowered Artist Award from Arts Mid-Hudson, and an Artist in Vacancy residency with the Newburgh Community Landbank.

2023 Exhibitions

'Cause We Be Complicated: Dialogues of Black Artists (March 25 - April 29, 2023) This was a multi-media art exhibition conceived by curators Jonette O'Kelley Miller and Karen E. Gersch. The exhibition honored Black History and featured sixteen visual artists working in a wide variety of media who each explore the reality that members of the African Diaspora are not monolithic. While each artist has a unique perspective and style that explores the dreams, languages and lives of Black people through a variety of social and ethnocultural nuances, none of the featured artists' oeuvre is solely defined by their ethnicity. The exhibit welcomed students from local and regional schools, including Mount Saint Mary's College.

Listening to Land: Imaginal Technologies, Material Conduits, & Landscape Translations Toward Perceiving Place

(July 13 - August 27) Curated by Alison McNulty

This was a group exhibition exploring practices of listening in relation to place and the place-making potential of creative acts of listening, wherein "to land" is a verb, and listening provides a point of ingress. The works included in the exhibition suggest that when one listens to land, the land reveals entanglements with intangible forces and phenomena, with buried histories, lost kinships, and with water systems. Rather than rendering landscapes that delineate land from water, human activity, or the cosmos, the works in the exhibition translate images of landscape into abstractions, experiences, revisions, and mappings that allow us to know the land through intricate and interconnected relationships.

Emerging Artist Fellowship

Ann Street Gallery and Safe Harbors are thrilled to support the 2023 cohort of our Ann Street Gallery Emerging Artist Fellowship: Rachel Olivia Berg, Michelle Corporan, and Shani Richards.

Now in its second year, the Fellowship program provides a supportive platform for emerging artists in Newburgh and the region, with a focus on those identifying as Black, Indigenous, and/or People of Color (BIPOC). During the six-month Fellowship, artists are provided with opportunities for mentorship, networking. and professional development, as well as a \$2,000 allowance for materials and representation in the gallery for a sixweek exhibition. Fellows are selected by a jury comprised of members of the regional arts community and gallery director, following an open call for applications each spring.

Our 2023 Fellows met bi-weekly from June through November for exhibition and performance planning, trips to regional art institutions such as Storm King Art Center and Dia: Beacon, and workshops on writing artist statements and proposals, budgeting, promotion, and networking. The Fellows also received regular feedback through critiques and discussions with Gallery Director Alison McNulty and local mentors, including Jean-Marc Superville Sovak, Jonette O'Kelly Miller, Seph Rodney, Daniel Giordano, and Jackie Skrzynski.

The Fellowship Exhibition, Re:Manifest (September 16-October 31) aimed to challenge romanticized histories of the U.S. through works informed by the Fellows' nuanced cultural perspectives and how they identify their personal lineages. Through their fellowships, Berg (Mnicoujou Lakota), Corporan (Afro Caribbean, Spanish, and Japanese lineages), and Richards (Afro-American) unearthed historical events, honored their ancestors, and explored places in the Hudson Valley to reclaim narratives that have been overlooked, forgotten, or ignored. The Fellows introduced their work in the exhibition in gallery talks during Newburgh Open Studios and curated a reading list for ASG's Open Reading Room & Media Space. The exhibition and talks were experienced by over 500 visitors during Open Studios weekend alone!

On Indigenous People's Day, the Fellows led a collaborative community event on Safe Harbors Green, during which they invited the public to engage in conversations about freedom, discovery, and identity, inscribing responses onto strips of fabric that were then woven into a collective tapestry. Following the event, the Fellows hosted a screening of the documentary *Columbus in America* in the gallery and displayed the tapestry alongside their exhibition.

Programming, Workshops, and Gallery Talks

ASG offered a variety of programming to support our summer exhibition, **Listening** *to Land*, including participating in Upstate Art Weekend, offering four free public workshops, providing a curated reading list by the artist Kite, and holding gallery talks by the artists in the exhibition.



Programming included engagements with several regional artists, beginning with an interactive **Seed Stories** project with artist-miniaturist Sergey Jivetin, in which he hand-engraved seeds with illustrations based on narratives gallery visitors shared about plants and seeds.




Artist and educator Katie Grove brought community together in a circle of making and storytelling with a hands-on **Basswood Cordage Workshop**.

Feral Hues of the Hudson River
Estuary was a hands-on foraging and paint-making workshop focused on the wild, weedy, and feral plants who green the city streets and shoreline of current-day Newburgh, led by interdisciplinary artist and educator Ellie Irons. Participants foraged for estuary plants along the Newburgh riverfront with Ellie, then returned to the gallery for a pigment and paint-making workshop.

Oglala Lakota performance artist, visual artist, and composer Kite, aka Dr. Suzanne Kite, and Robbie Wing, artist and musician from Oklahoma and citizen of the Cherokee Nation led a workshop called **Listening to Nonhumans**. Kite and Robbie led participants through an outdoor soundwalk, followed by a guided workshop, reflection, and conversation involving dreaming and futuring through listening.

Kite also curated a reading list for the Gallery's Open Reading Room & Media Space that serves as a source of inspiration and reference for her installation with Robbie Wing in Listening to Land. The books included can be accessed by the public during open gallery hours.



ASG is thrilled to announce our newest project, **From the Ground UP**, led by Ann Street Gallery's inaugural Artist Researcher in Residence, Jean-Marc Superville Sovak.

From the Ground UP is a coalition of local community stakeholders and artists led by Superville Sovak, who are dedicated to imagining ways to remember and honor African-Americans buried in the Newburgh Colored Burial Ground through conversation and the arts. The Gallery will be hosting related community gatherings, workshops, and presentations through the end of the year.

Meet Ralph M'Vore

This year, Safe Harbors launched a new performing Artist-in-Residence (AiR) program with artist, choreographer, and producer **Raphael Williams**, aka **Ralph M'Vore**. The AiR program provides a platform for a local performing artist to create work and artistic development opportunities for our Newburgh community, and to foster new collaborations with the local and regional performing arts community.

As our inaugural artist, Ralph received a grant from Safe Harbors to focus on his art and curated a robust roster of events, including film screenings, poetry readings, panel discussions, a National Dance Day celebration on Safe Harbors Green, and The Writers Lab workshop series, during which 12 young people wrote and performed in their own film. As a bonus, Ralph's performance troupe MVORE shared their talent in energetic performances at Soul Under the Stars, Black Renaissance Festival and Holiday Festival. Ralph's residency has been a truly wonderful collaboration, and we are excited to watch his star continue to rise!

50 Years of Hip-Hop!

As the world recognized the 50th anniversary of hip-hop this year, we celebrated Newburgh-style with an afternoon on Safe Harbors Green led by Daniel Villegas and emceed by Sergio Valentin of ParkSound Music. Events included poetry and hip-hop writing workshops, and performances by REL the Poet and Lito Koqui, LiteSkin, Jophlo, Self Suffice, and Genuine United OutKasts!



Ritz Kidz Circus Soars

Now in its 7th year, the **Ritz Kidz Circus** returned in August. During this two-week intensive program with a world-class team of circus performers and coaches, 30 local youth learned about leadership, self-reliance, teamwork, trust, and confidence, while honing their juggling, tumbling, clowning, and flying trapeze skills! The program concluded with a public showcase of the students' talents, enjoyed by a full audience of family, friends, and neighbors on Safe Harbors Green.
